CHICKEN-BLACK BEAN TOSTADAS

|--|--|
| 1 large chicken breast | 3 strips bacon |
| 1 cup coarse chopped onions | 2 Tbls butter |
| 1 cup coarse chopped green peppers | 1 Tbls garlic powder |
| 1 cup fresh corn cut from the cob | 1Tbls chilli or taco seasoning |
| 1 10-oz can Rotel diced tomatoes
(heat levels vary, choose carefully) | 1 tsp cumin |
| 1 15-oz can black beans drained | 6 oz shredded cheese
of your choice |
| 6 tortillas of your choice, corn or flour | |

In a sauté pan, melt the butter over medium high heat and add the onions and peppers. Stir until coated and cook until slightly tender. Add the corn and the Rotel (with liquid) and bring to a bubble. Add the beans, stir thoroughly and set aside. Cut the bacon strips crossways onto 1/2 inch pieces and cook until golden brown. Drain in a colander leaving a small amount of grease in the pan. Cut the chicken breast into 1/2 inch cubes and sauté in the bacon fat until cooked through. Toast the tortillas until crispy using a little butter for each one and place in an 11x 13 baking dish. They will overlap. Add the chicken and bacon to the bean mixture and heat back up until the liquid is steaming. Evenly spoon the mixture over the tortillas and spread the grated cheese over the whole dish. Place under the broiler until the cheese just melts and call everyone for dinner. A little hot sauce and sour cream makes a nice topping if you so desire. Enjoy!!
