

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
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## KEY LARGO CIVIC CLUB



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## This Valentines Day, take a romantic, nostalgic ride on the African Queen!

The iconic vessel the African Queen is located in Key Largo. Made famous in the 1951 movie of the same name starring Humphrey Bogart and Katherine Hepburn, she still remains a timeless classic. This famous steamboat is available for daily canal cruises in the Port Largo Canal area and also for private events.

#### HISTORY OF A CLASSIC

1912 - The African Queen was built in 1912 at Lytham shipbuilding in England. Originally she was named the S/L Livingstone She was immediately shipped to the British East Africa Railways company on the Victoria Nile and Lake Albert. Lake Albert is located on the border of the Belgian Congo and Uganda. She was built in a narrow way to navigate this river and was used to carry mercenaries, missionaries, cargo and hunting parties on their voyages.

1951 - John Huston saw the vessel and commissioned her for the movie he was directing "The African Queen" She was renamed

after her starring role.

1968 - The vessel was purchased by a restaurant owner in San Francisco and brought to the US for charter operation.

1970 - A man named Hal Bailey from Oregon purchased the boat for the price of her boat yard bill and took her to

Oregon for charter operation which was so successful he decided to bring her to Florida for year-round charter operation.

1982 - In 1982, late attorney (and Bogart buff) Jim Hendricks, Sr., discovered the vessel languishing in an Ocala, Fla., cow pasture and purchased the piece of movie history for a reported \$65,000. An equal amount of funds was invested to get the boat operational and Hendricks began offering visitors rides in 1983 while the vessel was homeported at Key Largo's Holiday Inn.

Among the vessel's highlights outside of the Florida Keys, Hendricks shipped the African Queen to England for the Queen Mother's 90th birthday celebration and for the commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Dunkirk evacuation in the English Channel. It also visited Sydney Australia, New York and Ireland.

In 2001, the African Queen's engine broke, yet it

remained on display for curious tourists and film buffs to view.

2012 - Captain Lance and Suzanne Holmquist signed a long-term lease with Jim Hendricks' son to restore the vessel in time for her centennial year celebrations. The Holmquists have overseen repairs and have taken pains to date it as it appeared in the film, replacing steel in the hull, replacing the boiler and oiling the black African mahogany to condition the wood. Once finished they put her back into operation as she once was offering canal and dinner cruises in Key Largo.

You can book a 1.5 hour cruise that departs from the Marina Del Mar and travels down the Port Largo Canal to the Atlantic Ocean before turning around to return. \$59 pp. Available at 10am, 12pm, 2pm, 4pm, & 6pm.

**Critters in Our Midst: Hermit Crabs** by Carol Ellis

Hermit crabs make their way from the ground up into the trees and everywhere in between.

Often when people move to the Keys, the first thing they try to do is make their new home just like the place they left. Locals can pick up pretty quickly who these "they do it where I come from" newcomers are, but within five minutes of meeting Angela and Brian, and observing their efforts to caretake our fragile Florida Keys environment, I knew they were a good fit here.

They came down as a family when their middle child Logan was transferred to Coast Guard Station Islamorada, and once here, decided not to leave. Jokingly Brian and Angela always said, "when the kids are gone we are going to quit our jobs, run away to the Keys and become bartenders, live in a one room shack with an A/C that is halfway broken and we wouldn't care if there are roaches!" A positive twist on the old story "Come on vacation... leave on probation."

They researched house prices, and soon realized

they couldn't quit their jobs and become bartenders. Luckily, their jobs allowed them to work from anywhere, so they got more of their full dream than most anyone would want.

The house they found online, located in Harry Harris Park, from an aerial view on Zillow, was your typical pea rock yard and stilt house property. The backyard borders a natural mangrove and buttonwood preserve, which if you were

to crawl a few hundred yards through the County-owned property, you could reach the shoreline.

Soon after moving in Angela noticed shells near the A/C condensate drainpipe, picked one up, and saw it was a land hermit crab (Coenobita clypeatus). In honor of their new-found friends, Brian and Angela named their property ~ "Crustacean Plantation."

Never having had a hermit crab as a pet, her first reaction was "I don't know how this works," but she learned. She started by counting her hermit crab encounters, and began numbering the shells. At some point past 100 crabs she stopped counting.

Hermit crabs have soft abdomens which require

protection of a shell, and who require bigger shells to suit their bodies as they grow.

She observed encounters where one crab was trying to hijack another crab's shell. A crab will approach a shell, be it occupied or not and tap on it with its own shell. If it is occupied it will continue its incessant thumping until the resident crab gives up the shell willingly, or is evicted by force. Lost pinchers or legs found on the ground are evidence of crab shell fights. Realizing a need, Angela started purchasing shells to put out

in a designated "Transfer Station" and almost immediately small or broken shells were traded off for the new and roomier models, kinda like a used car lot for hermit crabs. Broken shells are left vacant, as they no longer provide protection or cannot hold fresh water needed to lubricate the crab's gills.

Angela and Brian have spent hours in the garden, adding mulch and soil, making new beds for the native and

flowering plants, and adding water sources for the critters. Bricks and boulders line the raised beds full of soil and mulch. Hermit crabs need soil or sand substrate in order for them to molt; since the Keys doesn't have dirt, the hermit crabs must surface molt or find leaves, and bury themselves during this vulnerable time. In their new beds, Angela and Brian have seen little dig piles where a hermit crab has gone to molt. "We have provided them a "crabtat" - something they probably wouldn't normally have."

Creeping zoysia grass covers the former barren pea rock yard, leading up to an undisturbed tidal rocky area in the back of the property where the crabs

hang out. As we approach we can hear clacking as the crabs retreat and their claw clamps shut the shell opening; hermit crabs have keen eyesight so it is hard to sneak up on one. We stare at the rocks, and soon detect movement; a shell blending in perfectly contains a hermit crab on the move. A sign "Hermit Highway" designates where the crabs cross to go to the ocean to lay their eggs, and after having done so return to the dry land to resume their lives.

The "Crustacean Plantation" is on the Garden Club of the Upper Keys garden walk, Saturday, February 17th.

(gardenclubupperkeys.org/garden-walk-tickets). It is located in the Harry Harris Park area, a hidden gem, full of natural beauty, and a livable community for those who work here, and the creatures who were here before we came.

You might want to bring along a shell or two for a hermit crab in need.


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FRED'S TILTON HILTON - DOWNTOWN CARD SOUND ROAD

On the back of the shirt is Carol's original image of Fred's Place - the "Tilton Hilton." The restaurant, complete with slanting dance floor, blue crabs and cold beer, was located on the curve just across the Monroe County line, in the historic fishing village of Downtown Card Sound.

The photograph, taken in 1988 is a reminder of the once thriving community of nonconformists, squatters, and fishermen, who made their living from the surrounding waters, mostly by selling blue crabs. In its peak during the late 50's, this area was home to 100 residents, some who had State issued leases for "fishing camps."

Hurricane destruction, along with the politics of environmental safety, ushered in clean-up crews and by 2010, just a few wooden docks, and Alabama Jacks remain in Downtown Card Sound.

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## Updates, Clarifications and Nonsense

I get asked quite a bit about how I'm feeling and I usually say, "With my hands." Some of you might remember that as a Three Stooges joke but I first heard it from my Dad, who was born in 1922.

It's going on 4 years this month (Jan. '24) that I had congestive heart failure caused by diabetes.

Blood clots in one leg or the other is a common after affect of heart failure and that continues to be an ongoing issue for me.

I've been "roto-rootered" several times when the blockage caused ulcers (open wounds) on my left foot. The blockage as of my last test was estimated to be back to 85-95%. It makes walking very far or very fast painful but it's necessary to keep on moving while I still can.

Another after effect of the CHF was afib (atrial fibrillation) which became constant and made it impossible to sing/work. THANKS to all those who supported me through that summer while I was down, the Musicians Relief Fund and all the musicians who contributed their time and talent to the benefit.

Finally in the fall of 2022 I was given an ablation to

stem the errant electrical storm causing the misfire in my heart. Now according to the app for that, my afib varies in frequency, about 20% of the day, on average.

Just when I thought I could get back to rocking and rolling, the herniated discs in my lower back erupted in pain so severe I had to cancel the band shows.

It took 6 weeks of chiropractic manipulation to get me back on my sore feet. Thanks to Dave White for being a "roadie." We wouldn't have been able to go back to work without his invaluable assistance.

I've got a lot of wear and tear, arthritis, and a litany of age-related issues. I still haven't recouped my full vocal range from the CHF 4 years ago. I'm grateful for being able to play as much as I do, though I can't play as much as I want and need to in order to make a living.

The crazy thing about life is how different yet similar the human experience is for everybody. When I died briefly while in the hospital, my brief foray into the "afterlife" let me see how ridiculous and vain humanity is... we worry about the DUMBEST shit...the only

thing that matters is how we treat one another... not beliefs or politics.

It's also been 4 years since I've had an "adult" beverage. Drank too many before I was considered by law to be an adult anyway but it's all fun and games until you go blind from self-induced diabetes (Type 2) and whatnot. The great American diet of beer, bacon, processed bread, cheese and butter dipped in sugar, seasoned with salt and topped with fat, coated in chocolate...

My last vices now are weed, pizza and ice cream. I effing hate moderation but goddamn it, it is the key to achieving balance.


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
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## Finding Your Next Step in Life

Kinda brings a tear to your eye.



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
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## Why should we pay cash instead of a credit card?
