ARTIST OF THE MONTH: Master Artist Diane Whitney Smith




The Coconut Telegraph is delighted to present Diane Whitney Smith as Artist of the Month. Of all the artists I've met over the last 19 years, Diane is by far the most impressive.

Smith earned her Masters of Science and Art Education in 1986 while working as a full-time art teacher in Havertown, PA. She retired as Director of the Art Department there in 2013.

Here in the Keys she is the Co-Chairman of Education for the Art Guild of the Purple Isles, an advisor on the Florida Keys Council for the Arts, and has been co-chair for the History of Diving Museum' annual "Dive into Art" show in Islamorada for 6 years. Each year celebrates a different theme and next year's will be Fabulous Florida Fish. The goal is educate the children and the public on a different issue involving the sea. The emphasis this year is sustainability. Last years theme was the Coral Reef and involved 9 Monroe County

Schools and 45 artists from the Purple Isles Arts

Smith also volunteers at the schools and is presently working at PKS doing concrete benches covered with ceramic tiles created by the students and teachers. She is also teaching at Ocean Reef and at Jellyfish Dreams locally and on American Cruise Lines, Pearl Seas and Royal Caribbean. She is an avid traveler and has been to over 80 countries, most recently Sri Lanka.






The variety of mediums and subjects, as wel as the mastery of techniques demonstrates why Diane Whitney Smith is a Master Artist

"I met Diane through the Art Guild meetings. I was new there and she was on the board and was very welcoming. I could see she was organizing all sorts of shows and programs. Her creative mind is a little different than that of most people.

She had many other things going on in her busy world but made sure the library program was a big success."
