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
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

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## The Dirt on Cannabis - A blog by Luke Sommer Glenn

I should feel blessed and grateful that I have access to Medical Marijuana. It was a long fight just to be able to smoke "flower." I use quotes because that is a relatively new term on me used for bud. In 2017, then governor Rick Scott ignored the voters wishes and limited medical marijuana to vapes and concentrates only- NO BUD! More litigation was required before the state finally accepted the will of the people. And when I say it was a long fight, I joined the fight in the 80s, compassionate use was practically unheard of.

This is the reason I have never trusted the government. During the height of the war on drugs, I was made out to be a dangerous criminal, an enemy of the state; threatened with incarceration as well as extermination just because I found the marijuana plant helpful with my focus.

As a young man, my thoughts were scattered, and it was difficult to keep my mind on the task at hand. I was basically a good kid, and therefore wasn't deemed hyperactive or what they now call ADD among the other myriad names for the same affliction. I wasn't given amphetamines like the "dude" said. other kids that were more disruptive in class.

We were always told that marijuana was bad, real bad and that it would make your penis smaller. The DEA was headed by a guy that was titled the drug czar and they spread falsehoods and excuses why

potheads needed to be rounded up to keep the public safe. America needs enemies to keep the budget flowing.

The wife of a friend of mine once told me that I deserved to be killed for is how effective the brainwashing from the government was. She actually believed that I was going to grew was some of the best go insane and murder her whole family because that's what the DEA said marijuana smokers would do. Those lies were also propagated in the churches and the DARE program, which was deemed a billiondollar-plus failure.

Most of the strains were prone to be hermaphrodites (both sexes) and self pollinated, making the buds or flowers produce a lot of seeds. Sinsemilla (seedless marijuana) was harder to grow but could be done. I knew how to tell the difference between male

and female plants shortly after the seeds germinated and produced their first leaves.

Removing the males allows the females to spend their energy developing sticky, resin-dense flowers smoking marijuana, and that instead of producing seeds. One male or hermaphrodite ruins an entire pot patch.

There have been studies that confirm that plants







All life is connected to the Earth, Mother to us all.

Most of our plants were either stolen, found by police (who would pull the plant then leave their business card stuck in the chicken wire we used to keep the deer, rabbits and other critters from eating our plants, just in case we wanted to ask him how he liked it but we never called to ask) but we always managed to come up with a few pounds between us.

We didn't grow for profit, we grew out of want for something we couldn't find reliably otherwise. I was always proud of my weed and couldn't wait to share it with my friends. Watching somebody derive pleasure from your efforts is its own special reward. Like playing music for people.

Lucky for me playing and singing has always been legal though I have gotten away with murdering a few songs over the years.

Hey there fella... what's your name? You have big hind legs... shall I call you "Jumper?"

"No," the critter replies... "Those days are over for me. Oh to be a nymph again!"

Well how about "Chomper?" Your appetite for greenery is doing a number on my lily plants.

"Sorry 'bout that... a grasshoppers' gotta do what a grasshoppers' gotta do to survive."

Okay... well move along and we'll see you next year.

These beautiful, colorful creatures usually show up in my garden in the Spring. Their population is small, so I tolerate them; for the sake of a few chewed leaves, we can easily coexist.

Lubber grasshoppers (Romalea microptera) are native to Florida and the Southeastern U.S. including North and South Carolina, Georgia, and west through Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, to central Texas.

Adult Lubber grasshoppers are primarily yellow with orange and red markings. The juvenile nymph (immature) grasshoppers look totally different than the adults, and are almost completely black with a red stripe. Adults attain a large size, males measuring 1-1/2" - 2" in length and females often measuring 2" - 3-1/2".

Lubber is derived from an old English word which means lazy or clumsy. Juveniles are more nimble and will jump away if approached. The adult grasshopper is a very poor jumper, and is usually seen walking, or climbing to feed on foliage at the tips of branches. They have wings, but cannot fly. Since the adults basically sit on the leaf, even when approached, it is easy to lift them off the plant by pinching their two hind legs between your thumb and index finger. You can then relocate the critter to a place where it can do no further damage to your plants.



Lubber nymphs are usually very lethargic and easily handpicked. Their black coloration makes them look like a different species than the adult stage.

Unfortunately for the Lubber grasshopper, most people's first reaction when they see one is of terror. Jurassic monster!!! Dinosaur war!!! Exterminate it!!!

I can understand that grasshoppers are disliked by farmers because huge swarms can wipe out a farmer's crop. Farmers care more about feeding people than insects, so in this case it may be appropriate for the farmer to use chemicals to prevent crop loss and economic hardship.

Grasshoppers have few natural enemies. Their bright colorful pattern is believed to be a warning to predators, that they are not palatable.

In the home landscape grasshoppers can be seen early in the morning and in late afternoon feeding in flower beds, defoliating amaryllis, crinum and other lilies, oleander, butterfly weed, canna, Mexican petunia and lantana. Their veggie garden preference includes lettuce, kale, peas, beans and cabbage. So I get it! So how can we be humane while dealing with these critters in trying to salvage our home garden? You can hand pick and relocate. Another more final solution is handpicking and placing in a bag to be then placed in the freezer.



In general, these critters do not kill plants. What they chew on will return. For example, at a local nature park I frequent, I was shocked to see dozens of dead adult Lubber grasshoppers lying in the flower beds. This is a native, natural garden. It is non-manicured. So what harm is there to co-existing with a few grasshoppers? They are amazingly beautiful.

How could anyone kill such a beautiful species?

Pay attention young grasshopper. Act with knowledge and compassion. Though man is the king of the jungle and can do what he pleases, carefully consider the fate of the grasshopper in the home and natural landscape.

There is a reason for the grasshopper's existence, otherwise would it have been Adult Lubber Grasshopper. created?


#### **BREAKING NEWS**



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## Artist of the Month: Gisela Lorens Living the Colorful Life

A New Year's resolution in 2004 began an art journey for Gisela Llorens that changed her life. Dedicating more time and energy to something she loved but had neglected during childrearing years and her career in bookkeeping - MAKE ART!

After trying several mediums and working on drawing skills, her love became soft pastels. These are sticks of luscious color pigments but more sensual and textured, layered and finessed to be as expressive as oil paints. "I liked the spontaneity, the color you put down is what you get and no waiting for drying and working directly with my hands was a plus." Llorens remembers.

But, as with most art, doing one thing only is not feeding the "creative monster." She is now working in acrylics which frees her in other ways. Mostly self-taught, she tries everything from portraits to landscapes.


While her home base is in Miami with fall spent in Denver, the Keys have been her winter destination for over a decade. She has been an active member in the Art Guild of the Purple Isles (AGPI) since 2015. "I love the art community I have through AGPI and our Plein Air Group. I like that the lifestyle and art scene are laid back."

Traditionally a representational artist, impressionistic moods have been weaving into her style. She can be found at the AGPI's plein air outings. The spontaneity of painting in a garden with changing light and other artists has allowed her to loosen her style.


She was commissioned to do some Van Gogh replicas last year and is working on another currently "Boy, have I learned about brushwork and impasto techniques by doing this!" she says.

Llorens shares her love of art in the community too. At the Key Largo Library she has taught a class in pastels and another in Gyotaku - the ancient Japanese art of fish rubbing. In January she will be teaching a class featuring the style of Monet at the library's Painting with the Masters series.

Creating, interacting with other artists and being inspired by the Keys has become a good life for Llorens. Her art is on display at the Key Largo Art Gallery. Art shows are plentiful during the winter months in the Upper Keys and Llorens enters manyand often brings home a ribbon.



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


## Unearth the Past at Windley Key Fossil Reef Geological State Park

Step off the Overseas Highway in Islamorada, and you'll find a place that holds a unique piece of Keys history, literally carved into the ground. Windley Key Fossil Reef Geological State Park isn't your typical park with playgrounds and picnic tables. It's a magnificent and unusual park that was once a working quarry, and it offers a fascinating glimpse into the very foundation of the Florida Keys.

The park is open yearround and is a must-see for anyone with an interest in history, geology, or simply a desire to see something truly different. What you'll find here are massive, vertical walls of fossilized coral. cut clean by the giant saws of the quarrying operation that ran from the early 1900s to the 1960s. The coral, known as Key Largo Limestone, was used to build the Flagler railroad, a feat of engineering that connected the Florida Keys to the mainland. The park features a visitor center, a historic marker, and a short, easy walking trail that takes you through the stunning, man-made canyons.

This activity is perfect for history buffs, geology enthusiasts, and families looking for a low-key, educational adventure. The kids will be amazed by the towering walls of ancient coral, and everyone will appreciate the quiet beauty and historical significance of the site. It's a great way to escape the heat and learn something new without the crowds.

The very ground you stand on in the Keys is a fossilized coral reef, a testament to its ancient past. This park is the most accessible and striking example of this. It tells the story of the formation of the islands and the incredible ambition of Henry Flagler, whose railroad transformed the Keys forever. It's a tangible link to the past that helps you understand the present. While other places might have historical sites, only the Keys have one carved out of its own foundation. It's a unique and compelling stop that reminds you that every piece of this island chain has a story to tell.













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

FDOT has passed a new requirement for drivers.
