



Paradise, not a care in the world. Savoring an Irish whiskey in the coffee, watching the sun poke its head over the palms. The songs of our fine, feathered friends, in natural surround sound as they flit around to and fro earning their morning meal, is about as relaxing as it goes in Key Largo. Personally, I've always preferred a beer and a joint first thing in the morning, these days, though, it's just the joint.

Suddenly, the sounds of the garbage truck reminds me that, oh shit! I do have a care in the world. I missed the three weeks previous collection days so it's imperative that I not forget this time as there is no more room in the can.



Thank you for your attention to this matter!





While musing on the benefits of barefoot walking... Yoweee... a sharp stabbing pain emanates from my big

toe. I must have just gotten stung by a bee! Not to worry, I'm not allergic to bees, just a bit of pain now, some that beekeepers never have arthritis properties. Guess it is my lucky day... you can create a positive spin on

Ironically I got stung while walking in the future site of a butterfly and pollinator garden... a suddenly sunny patch in my front yard created by the removal of a dead tree. It's a perfect space for a pollinator/butterfly garden, whose plants require 6+ hours of sun per day. The more sun, the more active the garden will be.

Though butterflies are the poster children of pollinator gardening, birds, bats, moths, flies, beetles, wasps, small mammals and bees can all be pollinators. They visit flowers to drink nectar or feed from the pollen, then move pollen between male and female plants, fertilizing the flower's eggs, which then produce seeds to create a new generation.

Pick a site where there is well-drained soil, and access to water to establish and maintain the plants, and for the

pollinators to drink... a saucer filled with stones and water will do. Choose plants that attract pollinators, selecting plants with different colors and shapes, that will bloom during different months, to provide for a vear-round habitat.

When we think of bees, we think of the European honey bee that nests in beehive colonies. At the other end of the spectrum, native bees are solitary nesters that build their nests inside available nesting holes. Mason bees love tubular homes. Leafcutter bees snip bits of leaves to line their nests. Carpenter bees carve their nests out of wood. Paper wasps build umbrellashaped nests that hang underneath limbs or on your home's facia.

Like all living things, pollinators need a place to rest and some might appreciate a little house. Building a pollinator house is a creative project utilizing recycled materials such as

scraps of wood and dead bamboo stalks. They are called pollinator houses because pollinators visit them, but they are actually pollinator nurseries, because solitary bees use the holes for a place to deposit their eggs. The bee selects a perfect sized hole, typically around 3/8," then collects pollen and nectar to place in the tube, on which she lays one egg on top of the mixture. The eggs hatch and the larva eat the pollen mixture. When the time is right the larva pupate, and remain in that state until the following spring, when they emerge to start the process over

So worth it! Plant the plants, attract the pollinators, provide food and

stalk pieces, blocks of wood with drilled holes, and a glue gun are all you need to construct a pollinator house from recycled materials. Get creative!

housing for them, and the cycle continues. My initial choice of plants may not be perfect, but with observation, adjustments and time, the garden will become a thing of beauty.

Here's how I am planning the garden: since sun is a very important factor, I want to make sure that no plant gets too large to shade out any area. A good rule of thumb is to select one tree, two shrubs, one vine, and three wildflowers or grasses for a small garden. If more room is available, increase the number of plants at the same ratio. Plant in groupings for the most impact, and to reduce the appearance of leaf damage when the caterpillars are munching.

Think about what will bring you the most joy... and plant with that in mind. Hummingbirds are attracted to the tubular flowers of the following plants: Red firespike, Pineapple sage, Purple passionflower vine, Aloe vera, Firebush, Necklacepod, Coral honeysuckle vine,

Jatropha, Plumbago, Scorpiontail, Wild sage, Zinnia, Sunflowers, Red firespike, Balloon vine, and Purple passionflower to name a few. The Key West morning glory (Skyblue clustervine) attracts the sphinx moth.

For birds, you want plants that produce fruit such as Shiny leaf wild coffee, Satinleaf, Soldierwood, Bahama Strongbark, Little Strongbark, and Beautyberry.

The above plant suggestions are natives/or friendly additions for the Florida Keys, which is Zone 11. They are low maintenance once established, have fewer pests and diseases and the native pollinators will flock to your yard.

Don't be a member of the more-dollarsthan-sense crowd who would rather throw money at a problem than understand the root cause. Broadspectrum insecticides should never be used. They kill a large group of insects, including good pollinators as well.







Miami's premier Cuban folk music ambassadors Cortadito will celebrate the release of their new album The Guajiro Triangle and honor Cuban music icons the Buena Vista Social Club on Saturday, September 13, 2025 at Florida Keys Brewing Company (81611 Old Highway, Islamorada, FL 33036) beginning at 6 p.m. The following afternoon, Fusión Vayu will represent Colombian folk music in all of its colorful variations, with selections from DJ Supa Kundukta beginning at 3 p.m. Both concerts are free and open to all ages, to be held in the Beer Garden, and are presented by the Miami nonprofit Community Arts and Culture (CAC).

"Hispanic Heritage Month is a time to showcase our hispanidad, and we're excited to be presenting Cortadito and Fusión Vayu to Latin music fans in and around Islamorada," says CAC Founder and Executive Director Jose Elias. Since its origins thirteen years ago, the award-winning Cortadito has evolved into one of the torchbearers of a pop culture phenomenon that is two centuries strong. A traditional folk and acoustic band that focuses on performing one of the earliest styles of Cuban country music known as Son



(pronounced sOwn), their sound can best be described as reminiscent of the famed Buena Vista Social Club.

The band has just

released a third album single called "Guajira En La Madrugada", written by the late Alberto Pantaleon Hernandez and features quest vocals by the Havana powerhouse Aymée Nuviola. The first two album singles, "A Yemayá" (with Nestor Torres) and "Aqui Te Traigo Me Son" have been well received by critics and fans alike, amassing new followers and thousands of views and streams. The band will have vinyl copies of The Guajiro Triangle for sale at the event.

Cortadito was recently featured on NPR's Alt Latino podcast and is gaining momentum in various foreign markets like Mexico, Colombia, France, and Spain. The September 13th show will be the first stop of their regional tour which also includes dates in Central Florida and North Carolina.

Group Barrio Abajo, Fusión Vayo plays the folkloric music of the Caribbean Colombia by using traditional percussion instruments and flutes, with modern instruments, presenting styles such as bullerengue, porro, chandé, and more than 30 other unparalleled musical rhythms. Globally, their home country is known for cumbia and vallenato, but these are just two parts of their musically diverse heritage.
